Sustainable investment labels help investors find products that have a specific sustainability goal. This product does not have a UK sustainable investment label since the Fund has not been designed to meet the FCA's specific label requirements.

Investment objective

The Fund aims to provide growth in line with its risk profile in the long term, which is a period of five years or more. The Fund's risk profile is rated as 3 where 1 is a lower level of risk and 5 is a higher level of risk. Please see the Prospectus for an explanation of the HSBC risk levels and the sustainability characteristics of the Fund.

Investment strategy

The Fund will also incorporate sustainability characteristics and, as part of its investment approach, it will invest in assets that support at least one of the following three responsible investment aims: (1) To deliver an overall carbon intensity level that is at least 25% lower than the carbon intensity of the broader investment universe. (2) To deliver an overall Environmental, Social and Governance ('ESG') score that is higher than the broader investment universe. (3) To invest in assets focused on themes that contribute towards positive environmental and/or social outcomes. The Fund is one of a range of actively managed Global Responsible Multi-Asset Portfolios offered at different risk levels. The asset allocation of each fund in the range reflects the risk level. The Fund is managed with the aim of maximising returns in line with its agreed long term risk profile therefore any potential returns are likely to be limited by the risk profile of the Fund. The exposure to each asset class may be achieved by investing in collective investment schemes, investing directly in asset classes and investing in derivatives. The Fund is not managed with reference to a benchmark.

Main risks

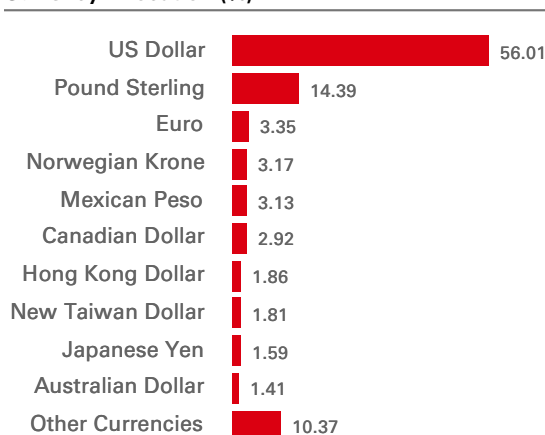

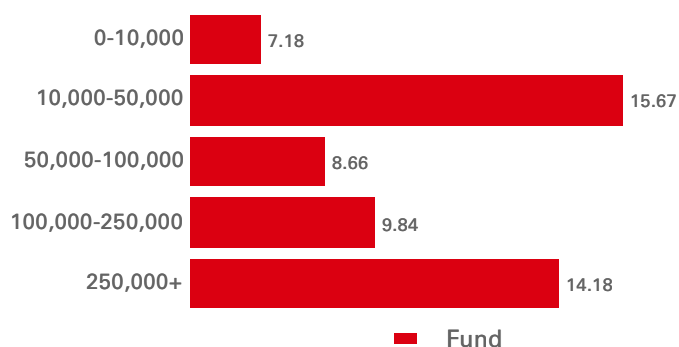

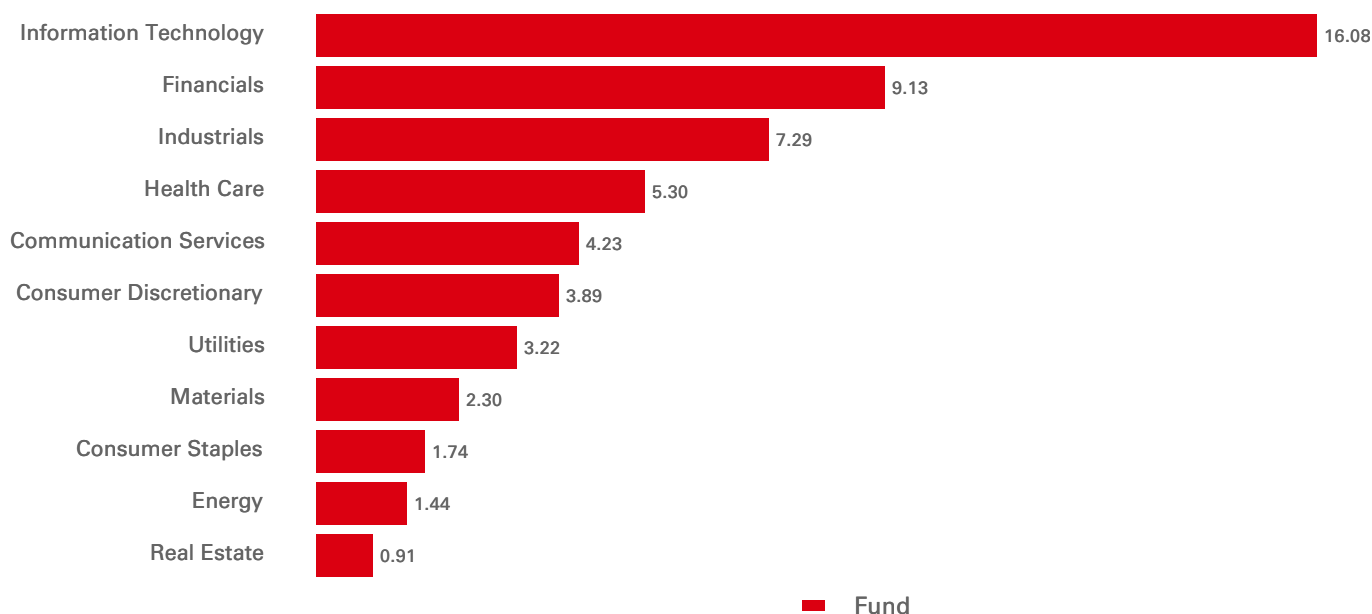

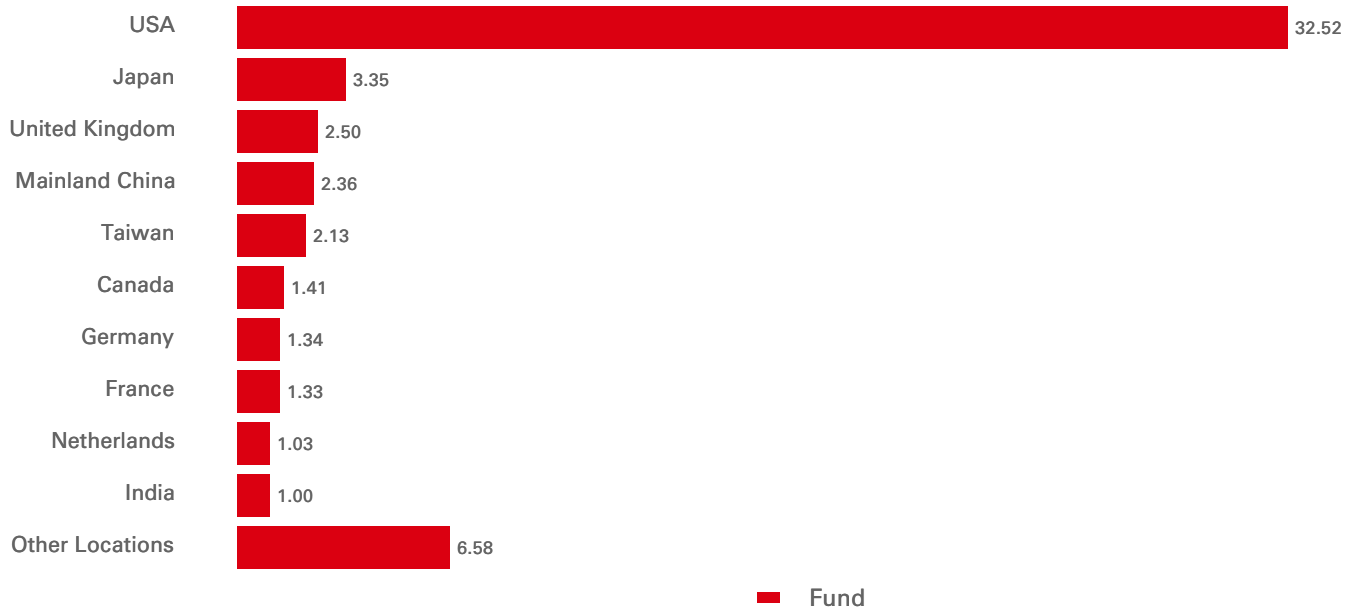
Market cap allocation (GBP Mil %)



Equity sector allocation (%)



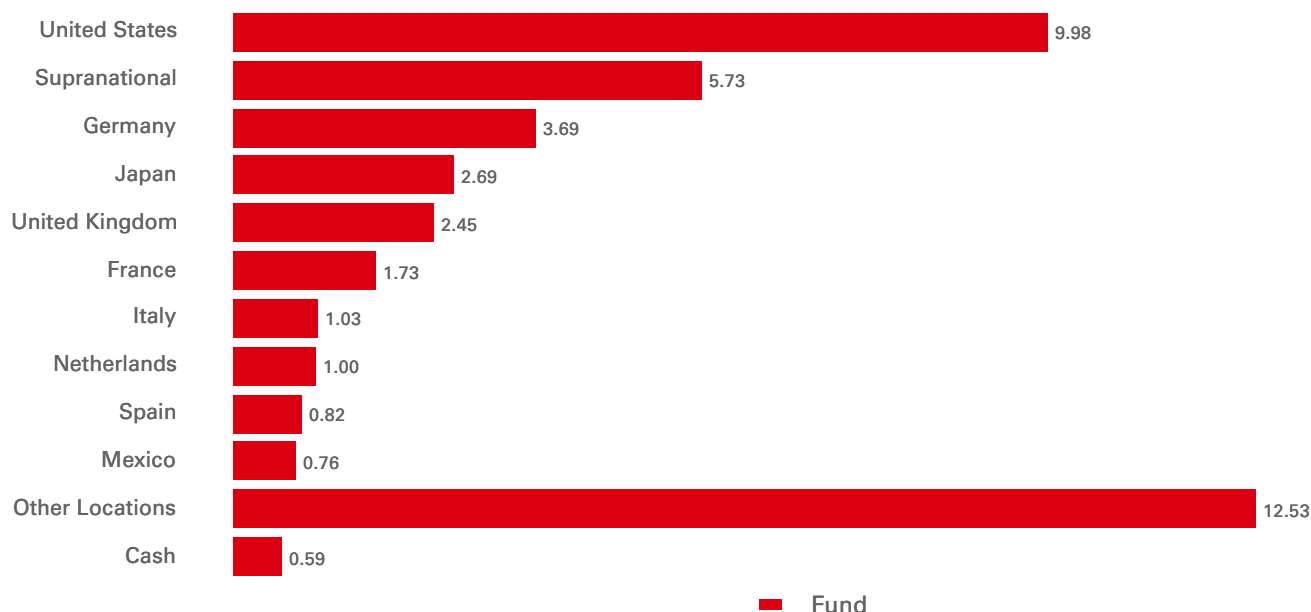

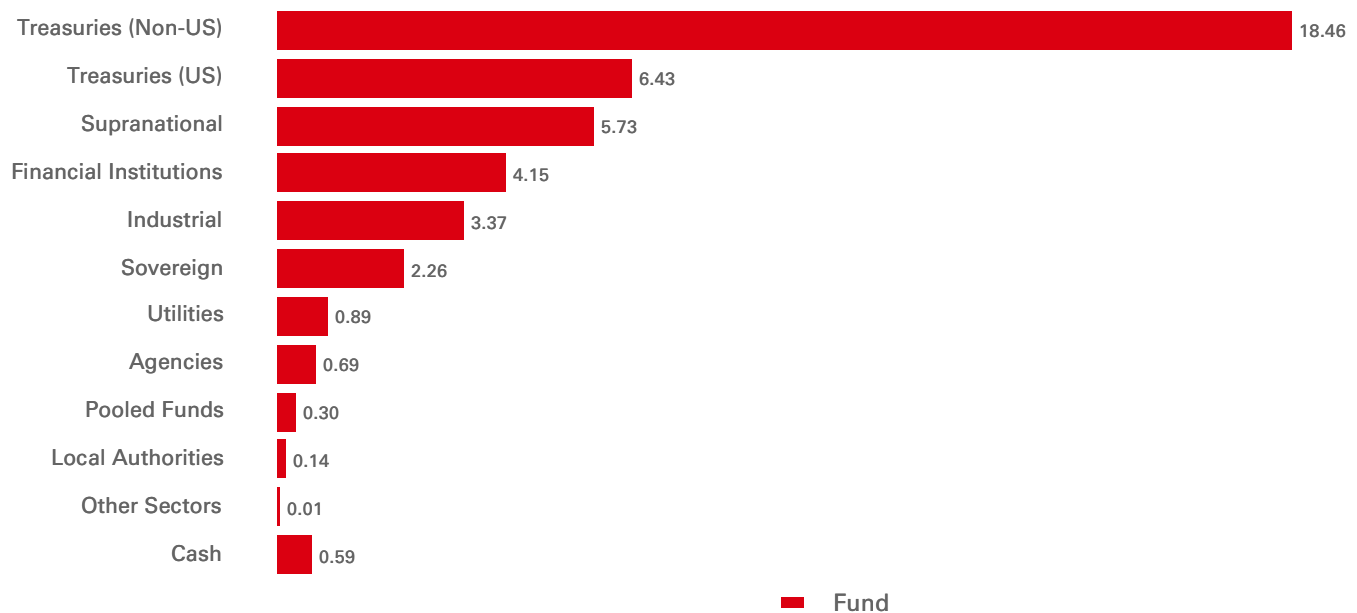

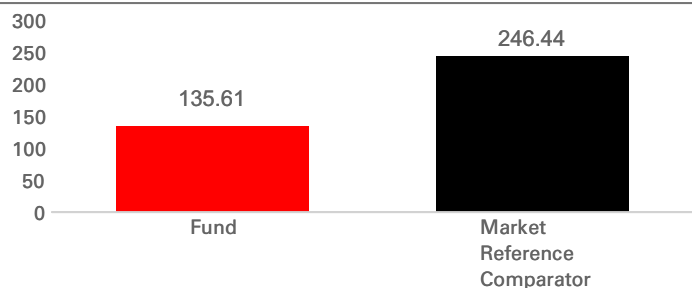
Fixed income sector allocation (%)

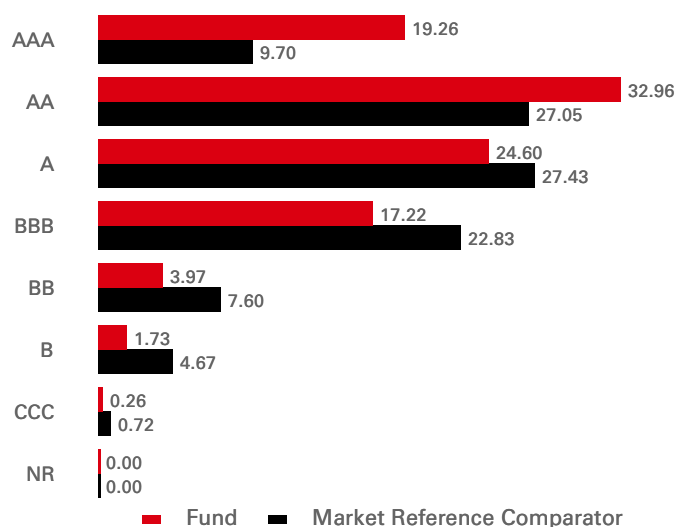
HSBC OpenFunds offer a choice of five different risk levels, to be selected by investors depending on factors like their financial goals, time horizon and capacity for loss. Typically, the more risk investors take, the more return they would expect to see. At HSBC Asset Management, we measure risk by volatility – how sharply a Portfolio’s share price moves in any given time period (up or down). The higher the volatility, the higher the risk. The table above shows the Portfolio’s return (for the primary share class or hedged currency share class) per year over the last three years (known as annualised) and the level of volatility over the same period. This can be compared against other funds in the peer group, as defined by an independent research company*. An example of a good outcome would be that the HSBC Portfolio return is higher than the peer group’s average return and the volatility (risk taken) is lower. However investors should consider their own priorities when it comes to returns and the risk taken to achieve them. *Morningstar Categories are used to define the peer group comprising funds they deem similar based on fund objectives and holdings. The average is a median.

Carbon intensity emissions (%)



Over the month, the average carbon intensity of the market benchmark was measured at 246.4 tCO₂e. Our investment approach resulted in a reduction of 45%, meaning the carbon intensity of the portfolio was measured at 135.6 tCO₂e.

ESG score distribution (%)



77% of the underlying issuers held by the fund are rated AAA-A, compared to 64% of those in the reference benchmark. The average ESG score for the underlying issuers held by the fund is 7, while that of the reference benchmark securities was 6.31.

To demonstrate the performance of the fund against its sustainable investment aim the ESG and carbon intensity scores of the fund are shown compared to the scores of a reference comparator. The reference comparator represents the ESG and carbon intensity scores the fund might have achieved if it did not have a sustainable investment aim. The reference comparator is a combination of market indices that represent the asset classes held by the fund and in the same proportions (weighting) as the fund, as shown in the table above. The composition of the reference comparator varies over time in line with the asset classes and proportions held by the fund. The table above shows the top 8 asset classes contribute differently to the ESG and carbon intensity scores although it is important to consider the weighted average scores of the overall fund and those of the reference comparator.

Stewardship

Stewardship in Action – Engaging with a stock exchange and market participants on enhanced corporate governance proposals.

Background - We participated in a consultation organised by an Asian stock exchange to provide input on proposed updates to the corporate governance code. The consultation covered enhanced governance provisions, such as director independence, time commitment, training, and board diversity.

Key objectives - Respond to the consultation to encourage higher standards of corporate governance in this key Asian market, aligned with our corporate governance expectations as set out in our Stewardship Plan and Global Voting Guidelines, as well as any relevant international standards. Engage with other market actors, including the stock exchange and corporate representatives, through industry associations such as the ACGA, to share investor perspectives and promote higher governance practices.

Engagement - We have engaged with the stock exchange, market actors, and investor industry associations to encourage higher corporate governance standards since 2019. During 2024, through the ACGA, we engaged with the stock exchange and a selected group of listed companies. We shared our views on why the proposals are important from an investor perspective to enhance board accountability and shareholder value, while also seeking to understand the corporates' challenges and concerns.

Outcomes - The exchange published the results of the consultation and adopted most of the corporate governance updates and proposals. It was encouraging that the items receiving the most pushback from corporates - independent director over-boarding and long tenure - were adopted, albeit with some concessions. We believe that these amendments provide definitive guidance for companies listed in this market as well as a signal of the
