Investment objective

The Fund aims to provide income and capital growth.



Investment strategy

The Fund tracks as closely as possible the performance of the Bloomberg Global Japan Total Return Index (the Index). The Fund may invest in Japanese government bonds which are Index constituents and will not embed a derivative and/or leverage. The Fund may also invest in the assets which are not Index constituents for the purpose of assisting in tracking the Index. The Index is a market-weighted index which measures Japanese Yen denominated, fixed-rate, nominal debt issued with a maturity of 1 year and above. The currency of the Index is JPY, and returns are unhedged. The Index is based on the Bloomberg Index Methodology which applies an eligibility criteria based on a set of fundamental core design principles which are designed to measure the underlying Index constituents accurately and comprehensively. The Index is measured by total return, is market value weighted and rebalanced monthly. The credit ratings of the Fund's underlying investments may vary from time to time. The Fund is passively managed and utilises an investment technique called optimisation. The Fund will not invest more than 10% in other funds, including HSBC funds. Main risks

- The Fund invests in bonds whose value generally falls when interest rates rise. This risk is typically greater the longer the maturity of a bond investment and the higher its credit quality. The issuers of certain bonds, could become unwilling or unable to make payments on their bonds and default. Bonds that are in default may become hard to sell or worthless.
- Derivatives may be used by the Fund, and these can behave unexpectedly. The pricing and volatility of many derivatives may diverge from strictly reflecting the pricing or volatility of their underlying reference(s), instrument or asset.
- Investment Leverage occurs when the economic exposure is greater than the amount invested, such as when derivatives are used. A Fund that employs leverage may experience greater gains and/or losses due to the amplification effect from a movement in the price of the reference source.
