Investment objective

The Fund aims to provide regular income and capital growth by tracking as closely as possible the performance of the Bloomberg China Treasury + Policy Bank Index (total return) (the Index).



Investment strategy

The Index is comprised of Renminbi (CNY) denominated bonds that are listed on China Interbank Bond Market. The currency of the Index is US dollars (USD) and returns are unhedged. The Index includes fixed-rate government and policy bank bonds with a minimum outstanding amount of at least CNY 5 billion, and a maturity of at least one year. The Fund will be passively managed and will invest in CNY denominated bonds. The Fund will not necessarily invest in every Index constituent and may invest outside of the Index. The Fund may invest up to 10% in funds, up to 100% in non-investment grade bonds, up to 100% in government bonds issued by a single government issuer and up to 20% in securities issued by the same non-government issuer. The average credit ratings of the Fund's underlying investments are expected to be in-line with that of the Index. Main risks

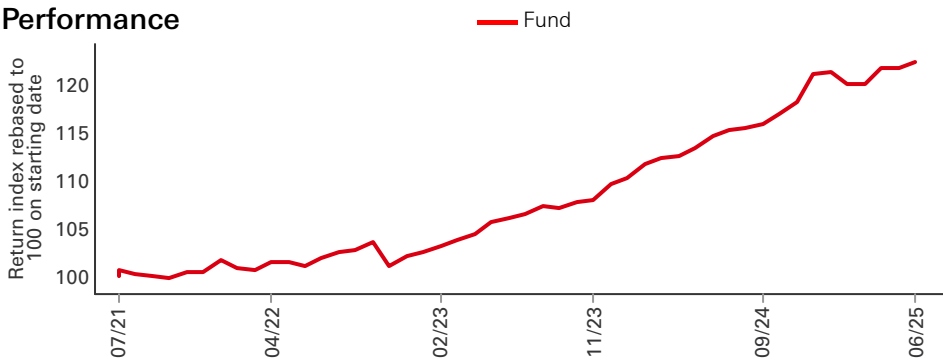

Risk disclosures
