Investment objective

The Fund aims to provide long-term capital growth.



Investment strategy

The Fund aims to invest at least 85% of its assets in the HSBC MSCI World UCITS ETF (the Master Fund), a sub-fund of HSBC ETFs plc umbrella. The investment objective of the Master Fund is to replicate the performance of the MSCI World Index (the Master Fund Index). The Master Fund Index is a market value weighted index designed to measure the performance of large and mid-cap companies of the world's developed equity markets, as determined by the Index Provider. The Fund may invest up to 15% of assets money market instruments including bills, commercial paper and certificates of deposits for ancillary liquidity purposes, and in derivatives for hedging purposes only. The Master Fund is passively managed. The Investment Manager does not integrate sustainability risks into its investment decision making process and so the impact of such risks on the returns of the Fund are not assessed. The Fund performance will not be identical to the performance of the Master Fund largely due to the fact that the Fund may invest up to 15% of its assets in investments other than shares in the Master Fund in accordance with the UCITS Regulations. Main risks

- To the extent that the Fund seeks to replicate index performance by holding individual securities, there is no guarantee that its composition or performance will exactly match that of the target index at any given time ("tracking error").


