Objectives and Investment Policy

Investment Objective:

The Fund aims to track as closely as possible the returns of the Bloomberg MSCI Euro Corporate SRI Carbon ESG-Weighted (EUR Unhedged) (the "Index"). The Fund will invest in, or gain exposure to bonds issued by corporates which make up the Index

Investment Policy:

The Index is a subset of the Bloomberg EURO Aggregate Corporate Index (the Parent Index), and is made up of fixed-rate, investment grade bonds issued by corporate issuers, as defined by the index provider. The Index seeks to achieve a reduction in carbon emissions and an improvement of the MSCI ESG rating against that of the Parent Index.

The Index construction methodology identifies securities based on sustainability exclusionary criteria. These criteria include the MSCI ESG Rating, business involvement screens and MSCI ESG Controversy Scores. Each company in the Index is assigned an ESG rating. Companies' weights in the Index are capped at 2% by market value.

The business involvement screens include, but are not limited to: a threshold on carbon emission intensity (measured and estimated using MSCI ESG Research's proprietary carbon estimation model); and the exclusion of companies with business activities in alcohol and weapons.

The Fund is passively managed and utilises an investment technique called optimisation. This technique seeks to minimise the difference in return between the Fund and the Index by taking into account tracking error (the risk that the Fund

return varies from the Index return) and trading costs when constructing a portfolio. However, there may be circumstances when it is not possible or practical for the Fund to invest in all constituents of the Index.


The Fund may invest up to 10% of its assets in other funds, including other HSBC funds and may invest in non-investment grade bonds.

The Fund may invest up to 10% of its assets in total return swaps and contracts for difference, however, this is not expected to exceed 5%.

The Fund may also invest in derivatives for efficient portfolio management purposes (such as to manage risk and costs, or to generate additional capital or income) and for investment purposes.

- The Fund may enter into securities lending transactions for up to 30% of its assets. However, this is not expected to exceed 25%.
- The reference currency of the Fund is EUR. The reference currency of this share class is EUR.
- Income is reinvested.
- Authorised Participants only may deal in the Fund's shares directly with the UCITS.
- The Fund's shares are listed on one or more stock exchange(s).
- You may sell your investment on most working days.
- Recommendation: this Fund may not be appropriate for investors who plan to withdraw their money within a period of 5 years.

Why is this Fund in this specific category?

This Fund is classified in category 4 because its price or simulated data has shown medium fluctuations historically.

Material risks not fully captured by the Risk and Reward Indicator:

- Callable Bond Risk Any unexpected behaviour in interest rates could negatively impact the performance of callable debt securities (securities whose issuers have the right to pay off the security's principal before the maturity date).
- CoCo Bond Risk Contingent convertible securities (CoCo bonds) are comparatively untested, their income payments may be cancelled or suspended, and they are more vulnerable to losses than equities and can be highly volatile.
- Counterparty Risk The possibility that the counterparty to a transaction may be unwilling or unable to meet its obligations.

- Liquidity Risk Liquidity Risk is the risk that a Fund may encounter difficulties meeting its obligations in respect of financial liabilities that are settled by delivering cash or other financial assets, thereby compromising existing or remaining investors.
