🕉 Investment objective

The Fund aims to provide long term capital growth and income by investing in a portfolio of European shares, while promoting environmental, social and governance (ESG) characteristics. The Fund qualifies under Article 8 of SFDR. The Fund aims to have a higher ESG score than its reference benchmark.

Investment strategy

The Fund is actively managed. In normal market conditions, the Fund will invest at least 90% of its assets in shares (or securities similar to shares) of companies of any size, that are based in, or carry out most of their business in any developed European country. The Fund includes the identification and analysis of a company's environmental and social factors and corporate governance practices as an integral part of the investment decision making process. Companies considered for inclusion within the Fund's portfolio will be subject to excluded activities in accordance with HSBC Asset Management's Responsible Investment Policies, which may change from time to time. The Fund may invest up to 10% in Real Estate Investment Trusts, may invest in bank deposits, money market instruments for treasury purposes and may also invest up to 10% of its net assets in other funds. 🖄 Main risks






