Investment objective

The Fund aims to provide long term capital growth and income by investing in a portfolio of Indian shares, while promoting environmental, social and governance (ESG) characteristics. The Fund qualifies under Article 8 of SFDR.

Investment strategy

The Fund is actively managed. In normal market conditions, the Fund will invest at least 90% of its assets in shares (or securities similar to shares) of companies of any size, that are based in, or carry out most of their business in India. The Fund may invest up to 30% in a combination of participation notes and convertible securities. The Fund includes the identification and analysis of a company's environmental and social factors and corporate governance practices as an integral part of the investment decision making process. Companies considered for inclusion within the Fund's portfolio will be subject to excluded activities in accordance with HSBC Asset Management's Responsible Investment Policies, which may change from time to time. The Fund will not invest more than 10% in Real Estate Investment Trusts, may invest in bank deposits and money market instruments for treasury purposes and up to 10% in other funds. 🖄 Main risks






