# Investment objective

The Fund aims to provide long term capital growth and income by investing in a portfolio of Eurozone shares, while promoting environmental, social and governance (ESG) characteristics. The Fund qualifies under Article 8 of SFDR. The Fund aims to have a higher ESG score than its reference benchmark.



# Investment strategy

The Fund is actively managed. In normal market conditions, the Fund will invest at least 90% of its assets in shares (or securities similar to shares) of smaller and medium sized companies, that are based in any Eurozone member country. These companies are defined as having a market value of less than EUR 10 billion as well as being constituents of the reference benchmark. The Fund includes the identification and analysis of a company's environmental and social factors and corporate governance practices as an integral part of the investment decision making process. Companies considered for inclusion within the Fund's portfolio will be subject to excluded activities in accordance with HSBC Asset Management's Responsible Investment Policies. The Fund may invest in bank deposits and money market instruments or money market funds for treasury purposes. #### Main risks






