Investment objective

The Fund aims to provide long-term capital growth and income by investing in a portfolio of bonds (denominated in Euros), while promoting environmental, social and governance (ESG) characteristics within the meaning of Article 8 of SFDR. The Fund aims to have a higher ESG score than its reference benchmark.



Investment strategy

The Fund is actively managed and is not constrained by a benchmark. The Fund will mostly invest in Euro denominated investment grade corporate issues whilst reserving the possibility of investing in bonds and similar securities issued or guaranteed by governments, government agencies and supranational bodies. The Fund includes the identification and analysis of an issuer's environmental and social factors and corporate governance practices as an integral part of the investment decision making process. Issuers considered for inclusion within the Fund's portfolio will be subject to excluded activities in accordance with HSBC Asset Management's Responsible Investment Policies, which may change from time to time. The Fund may invest up to 10% in contingent convertible securities, up to 10% in other funds, and may invest in bank deposits and money market instruments for treasury purposes. Main risks




