Investment objective


The Fund aims to provide long term capital growth and income by investing in a portfolio of Eurozone shares, while promoting environmental, social and governance (ESG) characteristics. The Fund qualifies under Article 8 of SFDR. The Fund aims to have a higher ESG score than its reference benchmark.

Investment strategy

The Fund is actively managed. In normal market conditions, the Fund will invest at least 90% of its assets in shares (or securities similar to shares) of companies of any size, that are based in a European Monetary Union member country. The Fund typically focuses on profitable companies with higher-than-average reinvestment rates that maintains or increases their current level of growth. The Fund includes the identification and analysis of a company's environmental and social factors and corporate governance practices as an integral part of as an integral part of the investment decision making process. Companies considered for inclusion within the Fund's portfolio will be subject to excluded activities in accordance with HSBC Asset Management's Responsible Investment Policies, which may change from time to time. The Fund may invest up to 10% in Real Estate Investment Trusts, up to 10% in other funds, and may invest in bank deposits and money market instruments. 🖄 Main risks



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
