Investment objective

The Fund aims to provide long-term capital growth and income by investing in a portfolio of inflation-linked bonds, while promoting environmental, social and governance (ESG) characteristics within the meaning of Article 8 of SFDR. The Fund aims to have a higher ESG score than its reference benchmark.



Investment strategy

The Fund is actively managed.

The Fund will normally invest at least 70% of its assets in bonds, the value of which is linked to inflation

The Fund invests in bonds issued by companies, governments or government related entities of developed markets and emerging markets. Up to 15% of the Fund's assets may be invested in

The Fund includes the identification and analysis of a company's ESG credentials as an integral part of the investment decision making process. Companies and/or issuers considered for inclusion within the Fund's portfolio will be subject to excluded activities in accordance with HSBC Asset Management's Responsible Investment Policies, which may change from time to

The Fund may invest up to 10% of its assets in onshore Chinese bonds and up to 10% in other funds. The Fund will not invest in securities from issuers with a credit rating below investment grade at purchase.

The Fund's primary currency exposure is to US dollars.

Main risks

- Investing in assets denominated in a currency other than that of the investor's own currency exposes the value of the investment to exchange rate fluctuations
- The Fund invests in bonds whose value generally falls when interest rates rise. This risk is typically greater the longer the maturity of a bond investment and the higher its credit quality. The issuers of certain bonds, could become unwilling or unable to make payments on their bonds and default. Bonds that are in default may become hard to sell or worthless
- The Fund may invest in Emerging Markets, these markets are less established, and often more volatile, than developed markets and involve higher risks, particularly market, liquidity and currency risks.




