Investment objective

The Fund aims to provide long term capital growth and income by investing in a concentrated portfolio of shares of companies that may benefit from increasingly constrained healthcare budgets worldwide, while promoting ESG characteristics. The Fund qualifies under Article 8 of SFDR.

Investment strategy

The Fund is actively managed. In normal market conditions, the Fund will invest at least 80% of its assets in shares (or securities similar to shares) of Healthcare Companies of any size, that are based in in developed and emerging markets. Healthcare Companies have current and/or expected revenue exposure to sustainable healthcare products; they are determined by HSBC proprietary analysis process including sustainable healthcare scores. Companies considered for inclusion within the Fund's portfolio will be subject to excluded activities in accordance with HSBC Asset Management's Responsible Investment Policies, which may change from time to time. The Fund can invest up to 40% in China A and China B-shares, up to 10% in other funds, and may invest in bank deposits, money market instruments and funds for treasury purposes. 


