Objectives and Investment Policy

Investment Objective:

The Fund aims to provide income and moderate capital growth by investing in global developed market shares, while promoting environmental, social and governance (ESG) characteristics. The Fund aims to do this with a lower carbon intensity, calculated as a weighted average of the carbon intensities of the Fund's investments, than the weighted average of the constituents of its reference benchmark. In addition, the Fund aims to improve on the reference benchmark's overall ESG score.

The Fund promotes ESG characteristics within the meaning of Article 8 of SFDR. More information on HSBC Global Asset Management's responsible investing policies is available at www.assetmanagement.hsbc.com/about-us/responsible-investing.

Investment Policy:

In normal market conditions, the Fund will invest at least 90% of its assets in shares (or securities similar to shares) of companies of any size that are based in, or carry out the larger part of their business activities in developed markets.

The Fund uses a factor-based portfolio construction process to identify securities in its investable universe and ranks them based on an income score derived from quality income characteristics. Quality income characteristics may include but are not limited to: Dividend Yield, Return on Investment Capital, and Free Cash Flow Yield. Following identification and ranking of the investment universe based on the income scores, a proprietary systematic portfolio construction process is used to construct an optimised portfolio. The optimised portfolio aims to maximise exposure to stocks with a higher income score, while also improving the ESG scores.


Companies and/or issuers considered for inclusion within the Fund's portfolio will be subject to excluded activities in accordance with HSBC Asset Management's Responsible Investment Policies, which may change from time to time. Please refer to the Prospectus for more details on including definitions and examples of the ESG and excluded activities.

ESG score, excluded activities and the need for enhanced due diligence may be identified and analysed using both HSBC's proprietary ESG Materiality Framework as well as research & information provided by financial and non-financial data providers. The Fund may invest up to 10% of its assets in other funds, including HSBC funds and may also invest in bank deposits and money market instruments for treasury purposes. The Fund may also invest in derivatives and may use them for hedging, cashflow management purposes, and investment purposes. Derivatives will not be used

extensively for investment purposes. Derivatives may also be embedded in other instruments used by the Fund.

- The Fund may enter into securities lending transactions for up to 29% of its assets.
 However, this is not expected to exceed 25%.
- The reference currency of the Fund is USD. The reference currency of this share class is JPY.
- The Fund is actively managed and does not track a benchmark. The reference benchmark for the Fund is the MSCI World. The benchmark for performance comparison purposes is the MSCI World High Dividend.
- The Investment Advisor will use its discretion to invest in securities not included in the reference benchmark based on active investment management strategies and specific investment opportunities. It is foreseen that a significant percentage of the Fund's investments will be components of the reference benchmark. However, their weightings may deviate materially from those of the reference benchmark. The MSCI World High Dividend benchmark does not constrain the Fund's portfolio construction. The Investment Advisor will hence use its discretion to invest in securities not included in this benchmark and deviation from this benchmark may be material
- The reference benchmark offers a large and diversified investment universe and is used for risk management and portfolio construction. The high dividend performance benchmark offers a more appropriate index to compare the fund's performance but does not provide sufficient investment opportunities to be used as the sole benchmark.
- The deviation of the Fund's performance relative to the reference benchmark is also monitored, but not constrained, to a defined range.
- Income is distributed.
- You may sell your investment on most working days.
- Recommendation: this Fund may not be appropriate for investors who plan to withdraw their money within a period of 5 years.



Segregated liability

HSBC Global Investment Funds is an investment company ("Société d'Investissementà Capital Variable") with segregated liability between sub-funds under Luxembourg law. This means that the holdings of one sub-fund are kept separate from the holdings of the other sub-funds and your investment in the Fund cannot be used to pay the liabilities of any other sub-fund.

The Fund is authorised in the Grand Duchy of Luxembourg and supervised by the Commission de Surveillance du Secteur Financier (CSSF). This key investor information is accurate as at 30 April 2025.
